Faith Community Nursing

Watching your child get a shot isn't easy. Millions of parents immunize their kids each year without concerns. However, over the years, vaccines have generated some controversy over safety, but no convincing evidence of harm has been found.

Are vaccines safe? Yes. All vaccines are fully tested before approved for use by the FDA. Vaccines are made from small pieces of proteins from cell membranes of viruses and bacteria in addition to dead or weakened viruses/bacteria. Vaccine schedules that cover approximately 14 different diseases are recommended by agencies and organizations, e.g. as the CDC, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Academy of Family Physicians.

Between birth and age 5 -This is when most of your child's vaccinations are completed. Many vaccines are given more than once, at different ages, and in combinations. For example, booster shots should be expected by ages 11, 12, and 16 through 18.

Immunizations record.

Treat your child's immunizations record as you would a birth certificate and keep it with your other essential documents. To download an -to-read immunization schedule, visit <u>www.CDC.gov</u>.
