Steering Committee, Purchase Offer, and Property Improvement Capital Campaign Updates

As we come towards the end of another year, there are several updates regarding ongoing projects to share.

The first update is in regards to the new service concept. The Steering Committee is finalizing its proposal, and in fact a rough draft was presented to Congregation the Council at its October 23rd meeting for review. The Steering Committee will then incorporate any council suggestions for the proposal. A final proposal will then be presented at the November 13th Congregation Council meeting. If the Council accepts the proposal, then the Council will set a date for a Special Congregation Meeting to present it to the congregation for consideration.

The second update is

in regards to the offer by Mt. Zion UMC to purchase our property. After our informational meeting, I contacted the real estate agent representing Mt. Zion and simply informed him that Grace wasn't prepared to consider the offer at that moment, but if that changed we would let him know. Since the congregation directed the Steering Committee to continue its work, logically as a congregation we need to at least let that process play out before we actively consider whether or not to sell our property. In the meantime, everyone is encouraged to consider the future of Grace through prayer, reflection, and mutual conversations.

The third update is in regards to a Capital Campaign to raise money for the improvements to our property that would be needed for our property to continue to be an effective tool for mission and ministry into the 21st Century. Obviously, these needs are directly tied to the other two updates - if we end up deciding to start a new worship service that tries to be as adaptive and accommodating as possible to people with special needs such as mobility issues, then making changes to the Sanctuary would be important so that the service could be held in the Sanctuary in the future. On the other hand, if the congregation discerns that selling the property is the most faithful direction to carry out the Lutheran witness to the Gospel in our area, then it probably doesn't make sense to make any significant changes (other than

immediate safety concerns). So this by necessity should be put on the back burner at least temporarily. (The proposal for the new service concept would include proposals for some property improvements, especially to the sound system in the Fellowship Hall.)

Stewardship, in its many focuses, includes how we utilize our resources to further God's creation. This past October, Grace Lutheran Church directed its Global Mission efforts to the ELCA's "Good Gifts" program.

The catalogs for this cause are available in the narthex, and within its pages, the ELCA explains that over 90% of any gifts goes directly to the program. It is worldwide and it directs the gift purchases to where its research shows the most need.

Though this Global Mission at Grace was concluded in October, as good stewards we can continue to keep ourselves aware of what our financial resources can do to alleviate poverty and hopelessness in the U.S. and elsewhere. From \$10 to buy 10 chicks, \$30 for a piglet, \$750 for a family farm, \$2500 to provide a water well or spring box, the costs are such that almost all of us could participate in some way.

What a blessing of hope where there had been despair.
