You'll also find a link to our Vanco online giving page, which allows you to use a credit card or your bank account to make your offerings. These payments go directly into our congregation's checking account. For now, you can still mail in your checks as well.

There's a page on our website that's a online version of our Attendance/Communion record sheet. Just fill out the form online, hit send, and the info is emailed to the church office. For anyone who participated in worship on the 15th and 22nd and took Communion, please fill out a separate form for each Sunday. If you can't access the website, please call the Church Office and Cindy will take your information for you.

Our website will also have links to our Zoom video conferencing meetings. Right now we're only using the free version so meetings involving 3 or more people can only last 40 minutes. Zoom could also be used for meetings and gatherings like Prayer Chapel and Council Meetings. For instance, we will begin offering a Zoom meeting that will serve as a virtual gathering 15 minutes before each service for people to check in with each other. We can also use Zoom to talk individually for an unlimited amount of time.

Also, our financial care for Grace Lutheran Church has not been postponed or cancelled, so that door to good stewardship remains open. Pastor Jeff's letter and our web site showed several ways to continue this support.

With prayer and humility, the Holy Spirit within us gives us the hope and strength to stand up to this present crisis, and the unforeseen challenges it brings. And know that social distancing does not mean spiritual distancing.

What do you need to Know? Most common questions about Coronavirus

* What is coronavirus? It is a class of viruses named for the crownlike spikes that protrude from its surface. They are found in people and animals, and some of them are responsible for the Common Cold. But the virus that causes COVID-19 is new to humans and so we don't have defences for it once it infects us for the first time. *How do I keep myself and others safe? WASHING YOUR HANDS frequently is the most important thing you can do, along with practicing social distancing, especially by staying at home when you're sick.

*What are some of the symptoms? Fever, Cough, Shortness of Breath, and a Loss of Taste and/or Smell.

*What can I do to manage being isolated from others? Keep a 30-day supply of essential medicines. GET a FLU SHOT. Have essential household items on hand but limit visits to stores. Stav connected with family and friends through phone calls, video calls (Skype, Facetime, Duo, Facebook, etc.), and stay connected with Grace through Zoom meetings and our YouTube Channel:

Holy Week and Easter Sunday

The Pinellas County "Safer At Home" directive will be in effect throughout Holy Week and Easter. That means that we will not be able to gather together for worship during those times.

We will live-stream the 9:45 am Palm Sunday service from the Sanctuary, as well as modified Maundy

Thursday and Good Friday services (both at 7pm). The 11:15 Palm Sunday service will be live-streamed from the Fellowship Hall.

As for Easter, the current plan is to offer a brief "drivein" worship experience on Grace's property at both 9:45 am and 11:15 am, in which the service would be both live-streamed, and broadcast on FM radio for those listening in their cars. If everyone remains in their vehicles, this appears to comply with the Safer At Home directive.
