since it's a lot easier for a new person to connect to a new ministry than it is to connect with an old one. The culture of congregation the would openly embrace new people, seeking to find personal connections to established members, and being obviously interested in them just as people, rather than as potential volunteers or sources of income.

So where is Grace is all this? While we are certainly not openly hostile to growth, we have room to grow in our "room to grow." We will be talking about our physical room to grow at our congremeeting. gational But we can also be intentional to examining our cultural and ministerial room to grow.

Dear Family and Friends of Grace Lutheran Church,

One of the most common questions I get as a Lutheran pastor is: "Why can't our congregation have as many members as (insert name of large, usually nondenominational *church*)?" The full answer is complicated, but it raises a core auestion about congregations that want

to grow numerically, but struggle to do so. What is holding them back?

Very often, the answer is a simple one: they don't make room to grow. This "room to grow" takes many forms, however. One obvious form is physical space. Some congregations want to grow, but their facilities are too small to allow for additional members to be added to their worship space, or classroom space, or fellowship space. This can be deceptive. since it can appear that a sanctuary might have plenty of extra seating, but if that extra seating is in less desirable places, like right up front, new

people probably aren't going to feel like there actually is room for them. Also, a sanctuary that has too much room can also be a barrier to growth, since they might feel like the place is devoid of life even with a significant number of people.

But "room to grow" is not just physical. Some of the most overlooked ways in which congregations struggle to make room to grow are within the culture and the mission of the congregation. In other words, some congregations simply are happy with who they already have within the life of their congregation, and new people are seen as threats to the cozy feel the tight-knit congregation has with each other. A visitor quickly picks up on the message that they really aren't welcome. Fortunately, this is pretty rare (though I have seen in it in person over my years of pastoring).

But more common is the lack of room to grow within the "prestigious" ministries of each congregation. Often the only ministries that new people are openly welcomed into are those that are the hardest to find volunteers for, and usually lack the needed resources to give them the best chance for success.

So, just based on these two facets of "room to grow" (there are even more), what would a congregation that has "room to grow" look like? Physically, the sanctuary would be about 2/3 full, and there would be specific spaces for people with particular needs interests like or wheelchair space, nursery/children's space, music space, etc. There would also be enough parking fellowship space, space, learning space, serving space, etc., to allow for spiritual and ministerial growth as well. But beyond physical space, the congregation would make room for new people through intentional mentoring withestablished in the "prestigious" ministries, and new ministries would be started on a regular basis
