
# GREETING

## FIRST READING

# Isaiah 40:1-11

Introduction to the Lesson: *As the Christians in Corinth await the advent of Jesus, Paul reminds them how the Lord has already enriched them through spiritual gifts and will continue to strengthen them until the coming day of the Lord.* 

Reader: "Comfort my people," says our God. "Comfort them! 2 Encourage the people of Jerusalem. Tell them they have suffered long enough and their sins are now forgiven. I have punished them in full for all their sins."

3 A voice cries out, "Prepare in the wilderness a road for the Lord! Clear the way in the desert for our God! 4 Fill every valley; level every mountain. The hills will become a plain, and the rough country will be made smooth. 5 Then the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all people will see it. The Lord himself has promised this." 6 A voice cries out, "Proclaim a message!" "What message shall I proclaim?" I ask. "Proclaim that all human beings are like grass; they last no longer than wild flowers. 7 Grass withers and flowers fade when the Lord sends the wind blowing over them. People are no more enduring than grass. 8 Yes, grass withers and flowers fade, but the word of our God endures forever."

Reader: The word of the Lord. Congregation: Thanks be to God.

## GOSPEL LESSON

Introduction to the Gospel: *The Gospel of Mark does not begin with a story of Jesus 'birth but with the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord.* 

Mark 1:1-8

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to Mark in the 1st chapter. Congregation: Glory to you, O Lord.


This is the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. 2 It began as the prophet Isaiah had written: "God said, 'I will send my messenger ahead of you to open the way for you.' 3 Someone is shouting in the desert, 'Get the road ready for the Lord; make a straight path for him to travel!" 4 So John appeared in the desert, baptizing and preaching. "Turn away from your sins and be baptized," he told the people, "and God will forgive your sins." 5 Many people from the province of Judea and the city of Jerusalem went out to hear John. They confessed their sins, and he baptized them in the Jordan River. 6 John wore clothes made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. 7 He announced to the people, "The man who will come after me is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to bend down and untie his sandals. 8 I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Pastor: Lift up your hearts.


## Congregation: We lift them to the Lord.

# PRAYERS AFTER COMMUNION


